*109 Functions and powers*

- (1) The Maunga Authority has the powers and functions conferred on it by or under this Act or any other enactment.
- (2) In exercising its powers and carrying out its functions in relation to the maunga, the Maunga Authority must have regard to—
  - (a) the spiritual, ancestral, cultural, customary, and historical significance of the maunga to Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau; and
  - (b) section 41(2).
- (3) In exercising its powers and carrying out its functions in relation to the administered lands, the Maunga Authority must have regard to the spiritual, ancestral, cultural, customary, and historical significance of the administered lands to Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau.

[Emphasis added]

*41 Maunga must remain as reserves vested in trustee*

- (1) This section applies to each maunga once the maunga is—
  - (a) vested in the trustee under subpart 1, 2, or 3 of this Part;and
  - (b) Declared a reserve under any of sections 18 to 29, 33, and 39.
- (2) The maunga is held by the trustee for the common benefit of Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau and the other people of Auckland.

## 1. Key highlights in this quarter:

### Planting season

The team started the community and kura planting days within this quarter over ngā Tūpuna Maunga; including Ōtāhuhu, Puketāpapa/Pukewīwī, Te Tātua a Riukiuta, Ōhinerau and Ōhūiarangi. Approximately 200+ volunteers came to the 6 days, and 10000 plants planted.

Delivered the jobs for nature program to multiple schools. This includes an overview of the TMA's efforts around biodiversity and biosecurity and how tamariki and kura can get involved in these efforts to uplift our Maunga.

**Financial Commentary:**

## Removal of Tūpuna Maunga from Schedule 2 – Auckland Council Policy on Dogs 2019

<b>Purpose</b>	To consider whether to recommend removal all Tūpuna Maunga from Schedule 2 of the Auckland Council Policy on Dogs 2019.
<b>Recommendation</b>	That the Tūpuna Maunga Authority:  a) <b>requests</b> management to make a submission to the Auckland Council on its review of the Auckland Council Policy of Dogs 2019 seeking the removal of all Tūpuna Maunga from Schedule 2 of that policy.

### Background

1. The Dog Control Act (DCA) 1996 requires Auckland Council to have a policy on dogs and a bylaw to implement the policy.
2. The Auckland Council Policy on Dogs 2019 (Policy on Dogs) came into force on 1 November 2019 with the main objective being to keep dogs as a positive part of the life of Aucklanders by:
  - a. Maintaining opportunities for owners to take their dogs into public places
  - b. Adopting measures to minimise the problems caused by dogs
  - c. Protecting dogs from harm and ensuring their welfare.
3. The Auckland Council bylaw must be reviewed in 2024 to determine if it is still appropriate having regard to a number of matters including:
  - a. The need to minimise danger, distress, and nuisance to the community generally.
4. Whilst the Policy on Dogs does not expire, this policy will be included in the review process. The policy includes general dog access rules in public spaces as well as designated dog access rules, which impacts 4 Maunga.

### Statutory and other considerations

5. The process and any decision to adopt an Operational Plan, and summary thereof, is required to take into account the legislative and policy framework.
6. Section 109(2) of Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau Collective Redress Act 2014 requires the Authority to have regard to the spiritual, ancestral, cultural, customary, and historical significance of the Maunga to Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau and that the Tūpuna Maunga is held in trust for Ngā Mana Whenua and the other people of Auckland.
7. The Tūpuna Maunga Authority's Integrated Management Plan was unanimously adopted (Mana Whenua and Auckland Council members) by the Authority pursuant to the Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau Collective Redress Act 2014 and Reserves Act 1977. The Integrated Management Plan describes a series of "Values" and "Pathways" that guide all activities on the Tūpuna Maunga.

8. The Tūpuna Maunga Authority (Mana Whenua and Auckland Council members) unanimously adopted the Tūpuna Maunga Strategies at Hui 50 on 25 September 2020. The Tūpuna Maunga Strategies are 7 key sections that outline the strategic direction with regards to education, Biodiversity, Tūpuna Maunga design, Recreation, commercial activities and monitoring. Together with the IMP, these strategies inform guide and manage the activities undertaken on the Maunga.
9. The Authority administers the Tūpuna Maunga under the Reserves Act 1977 and pursuant to Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau Collective Redress Act 2014. The Hauraki Gulf Marine Park Act 2000 is also applicable in relation to Maungauika.

## **Discussion**

### **Current Dog Access on the Maunga**

#### Schedule Definitions in the Auckland Council Policy

10. The Policy on Dogs includes two schedules that relate to dog access rules, these being Schedule 1 and Schedule 2.
11. Schedule 2 refers to dog access rules in defined locations which are under decision making control of Auckland Council. Currently there are 3 Maunga and two designated areas on Maungawhau that are defined as Schedule 2 sites.
  - Ōwairaka /Te Ahi-kā-a-Rakataura/Mount Albert.
  - Takarunga/Mount Victoria.
  - Te Tātua-a-Riukiuta/Big King.
  - Maungawhau Domain: the fenced paddock between Clive Rd entrance and Summit Rd.
  - Tahaki Reserve: north-east of the bowl demarcated by the bush and pathway,
12. Schedule 1 in the Policy on Dogs relates to general dog access rules. The remaining Tūpuna Maunga are subject to Schedule 1 default dog access rules (clause (c) to (d)).
13. See attachment A for current dog access rules on the Maunga.

### **Current Decision-Making Authority on the Maunga**

#### Schedule 2 Decision-Maker

14. The Maunga and included areas listed above are all specifically mentioned in Schedule 2. This means that the decision-maker regarding dog access rules in these areas is Auckland Council. Management recommend it is the Tūpuna Maunga Authority that should have the authority to set policy positions (as provided for in Schedule 1).

#### Schedule 1 Decision-Maker

15. Any Maunga that are not specifically listed in Schedule 2 are under the decision-making authority of the Tūpuna Maunga Authority.

### **Recommending the Transfer Decision-Making Authority**

#### Auckland Council review of Policy on Dogs 2019

16. The Authority has an opportunity to request that through the review process, Auckland Council reclassify all Schedule 2 Maunga and areas to Schedule 1. This would ensure that the Authority has the future ability to make dog access policy decisions on every Maunga.
17. All current dog access rules would remain the same if the schedule change was implemented after review, until such a time as the Authority may deem it necessary to change policy position.
18. The approximate timeline for this Council review process includes the following:
  - a. Seeking local board feedback on the draft proposal in October,
  - b. The Regulatory and Community Safety Committee recommends a proposal to the Governing Body to adopt for public consultation in December.
  - c. Public consultation is scheduled for January/February 2025.
  - d. Final decision is expected to be made in July 2025.

## Māra Hūpara at Ōtāhuhu/Mt Richmond: Recommended Stage 1 Concept Design

<b>Purpose</b>	To consider a concept design for the reinstatement of the neighbourhood playground at Ōtāhuhu / Mount Richmond.
<b>Recommendation</b>	That the Tūpuna Maunga Authority:  a) <b>approve</b> the replacement of the neighbourhood playground at Ōtāhuhu / Mount Richmond in accordance with Attachment A to this report.

### Background

1. The Auckland Storm events in early 2023 resulted in a large tree falling over and destroying the existing neighbourhood playground at Ōtāhuhu/Mt Richmond. This event has provided the opportunity not only for the Tūpuna Maunga Authority to look at future play opportunities for the Maunga but also to investigate ways to enhance the mauri of the Maunga, improve the visitor experience, and increase community understanding of and respect for the Maunga.
2. The site location is as below.



### Statutory and other considerations

3. Any decision to determine management within a reserve must take into account the legislative and policy framework.
4. The Authority administers the Tūpuna Maunga under the Reserves Act 1977 and pursuant to Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau Collective Redress Act 2014. The Hauraki Gulf Marine Park Act 2000 is also relevant.
5. Section 109(2) of Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau Collective Redress Act 2014 requires the Authority to have regard to the spiritual, ancestral, cultural, customary, and historical significance of the Maunga to Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau and that the Tūpuna Maunga is held in trust for Ngā Mana Whenua and the other people of Auckland.
6. The Tūpuna Maunga Authority's Integrated Management Plan (IMP) was adopted by the Authority in terms of Ngā Mana Whenua o Tāmaki Makaurau Collective Redress Act 2014 and the Reserves Act 1977. The Integrated Management Plan describes a series of "Values" and "Pathways" that guide all activities on the Tūpuna Maunga. The primary focus of the IMP is to protect the health and well-being of the Tūpuna Maunga.
7. The Tūpuna Maunga Authority adopted the Tūpuna Maunga Strategies at Hui 50 on 25 September 2020. The Tūpuna Maunga Strategies are 7 key sections that outline the strategic direction with regards to education, Biodiversity, Tūpuna Maunga design, Recreation, commercial activities and monitoring. Together with the IMP, these strategies inform guide and manage the activities undertaken on the Maunga.

### Discussion

#### Reporepo Proposal

8. The Authority has considered this project at Hui 91 (29 April 2024) and Hui 93 (29 July 2024). The concept presented as Attachment A incorporates the Authority's feedback from those hui. The concept of Reporepo is based on traditional hīnaki (eel trap). Key play feature takes the form of a hīnaki (eel trap) acknowledging the wetland basin that was once a source of kai and mahinga kai. Play experiences include swinging, climbing, rocking, wheeled play, imaginative play, sensory nature play. This concept utilises New Zealand manufactured play elements.
9. In relation to interpretative signage, this element will be progressed through a separate project which will look at signage across the Maunga including the playground.

#### Next Steps

10. With the approval of the Stage 1 Tākaro Concept, the Team will proceed to procurement and implementation. The Team is working towards having the playground reinstated in Summer 2025.

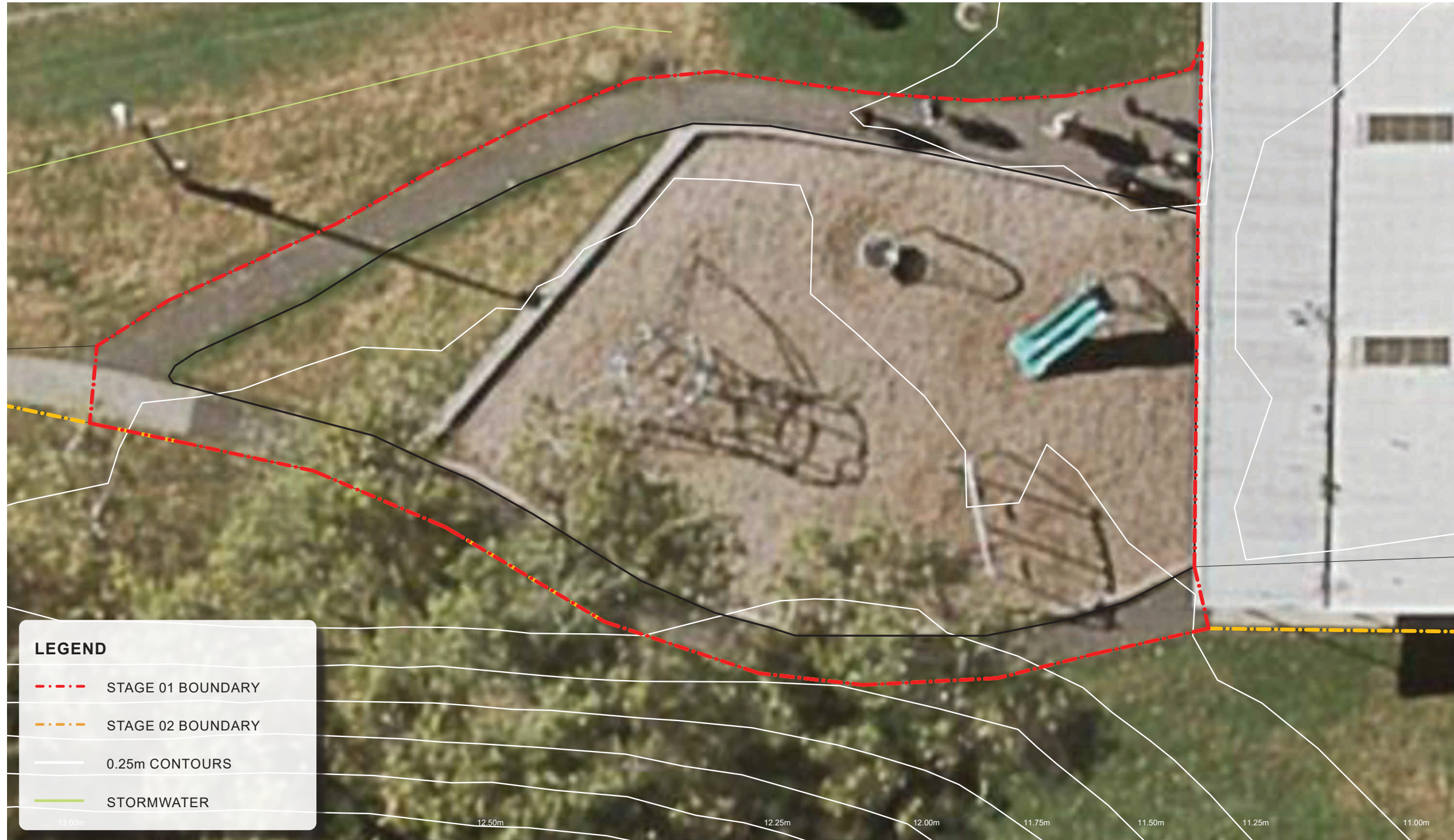
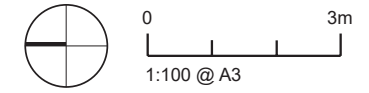

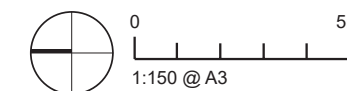
